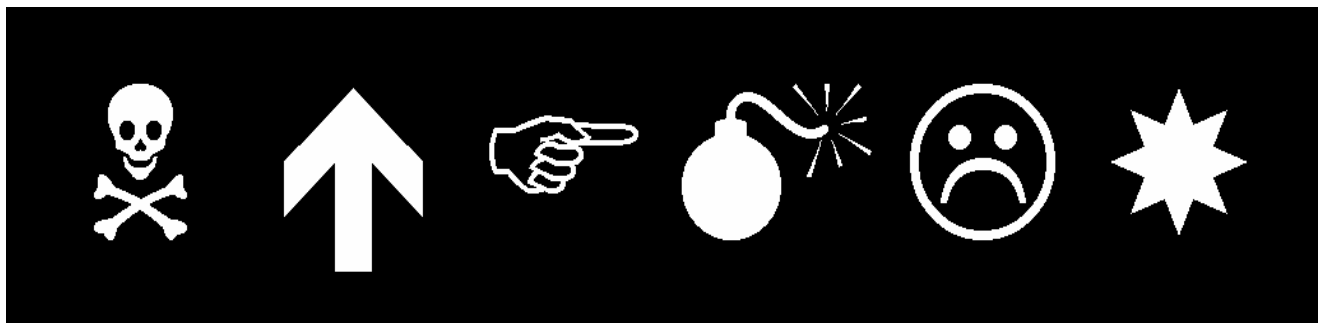




## At least the PJ's don't need a Power Point

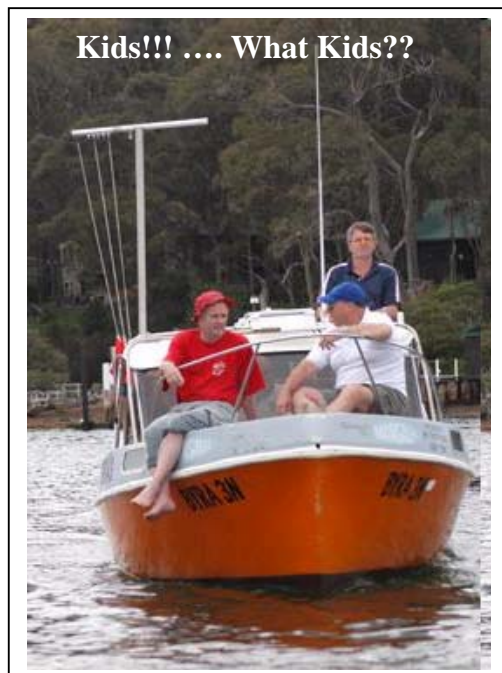

*But we all know,*

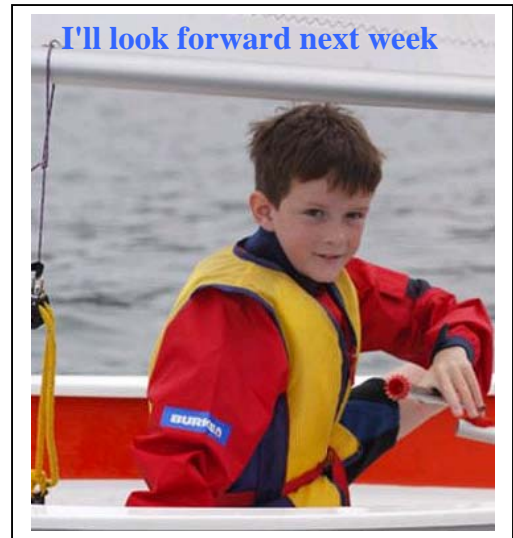
*When the cookies show,*
